In the heat of the moment

When a volcano erupts, most people want to get as far away as possible, as quickly as they can! German engineer Martin Rietze, on the other hand, grabs his camera and tries to get as close as he can and stay alive at the same time.

He's so close that he can feel the heat burning his face even through his gas mask. The lava flow is about a meter away and it's getting closer every second. The ground beneath his feet is shaking and there is a deafening roar like a plane taking off. He can't stay this close for too long because the gases and acids will destroy his camera, but Martin Rietze waits just long enough to see flaming hot lava and ash explode out of nearby crater and gets the perfect shot.

Martin is a freelance photographer whose stunning photographs of volcanic eruptions are in high demand with newspapers and magazines all over the world. He is one of a small but dedicated group of volcanic chasers. When a dormant volcano becomes active, they book the first flight to be as near as possible to it, set up camp and wait, sometimes for as long as two weeks. It takes a lot of patience as a volcano can erupt at any time, night or day, and clouds, fog and steam often block the view. The final results though, like Martin's shots of volcanic lightning-a phenomenon that still mystifies scientists-are definitely worth it!

Martin says that he's had more accidents when mountain climbing than volcano chasing, but that doesn't stop him from taking precautions because this is a job where safety is priority. Volcano chasing is quite risky.
